Dear Sir

With regards to the price of the  
grammar & the percentage we  
would make the following remarks,

1) The price to the public should  
be the same here as in Paris  
e.g. if it be 12 francs there it should  
not be more than 10/- here. -

2) The usual percentage to the  
trade is 25 p cent. & 13 copiers  
to the dozen. -

3) If you wish us to sell it here  
to the trade, as Messrs. some one  
does in Paris - then we should  
require 10 p cent extra commission

eg. if it be 12 pces or 10/-  
we should account to you for  
1/6. or 9 pces per copy & if we  
are to sell it to the Trade it  
will be 10 pces less or 1/9 of 8. 10.

may stand over.
